Scene 1 - starts front of tabs

Nanny Nora: Well hello there! How lovely to see you all, and you're still here, even after the singing.

It's been 3 months since you saw us singing 'Celebrations 'and waiting with excitement for our wonderful little princess to be born. What do you mean it feels longer?! You're not bored already, are you? Anyway, she's here! The baby's here! I know... it's so exciting, isn't it. And do you know what's more exciting? It's a girl! But then you guessed that, I expect. And guess what else... Well come on guess... is anyone out there? What a quiet audience... Well, I'm going to have to tell you aren't I? Wait for it...I have been made the Nanny for her! Yes, that's right...me the Nanny!

I was the housekeeper but they've noticed how good I am with children...I love them you know, and I'm now the Nanny! I'm so

thrilled. It means that I get to spend time with her more than anyone else, and I do so love her.

Oh how rude of me, I've not even introduced myself yet, have I? Well, I'm Nora, Nora Bone but now known as Nanny Nora. Much nicer don't you think? Actually I came to ask if there's a Phillip in the audience? Yes? It's just that I've found your screwdriver!

Today is going to be Princess Kathryn's... yes that's her name, Kathryn ... Princess Kathryn's christening day. So wonderful!

I'll tell you more about me later but now I must go and get ready for the christening. Oh and there's an awful lot of important people here too. So exciting!

Curtain opens and lights come up on the interior of the palace again...King and queen on thrones at the back of the stage, crib by Passionnella's side. Trumpet sound and King Ferdinand is announced.

Herald: Please welcome his royal highness King Ferdinand and his son Prince William.

King C: King Arthur and Queen Passionnella, thank you for inviting us to this christening of Princess Kathryn. (deep bow) What a wonderful occasion and one where we will unite our two kingdoms.

King F: Our pleasure dear boy, and this is your young son who will be betrothed to Kathryn?

King C: Yes, allow me to present Prince William to you. A mere child at present but when Kathryn is 18 he will offer her his hand in marriage.

William: Deep bow...Your servant, majesties.

Queen P: A handsome young man, you will do nicely. Is he fit and well?

King F: Oh yes, he does yoga you know and can strike a right, royal pose!

Herald: Please welcome, Count and Countess Clumsy of Columbia.

They walk forward and the countess falls over as she curtsies, the count goes to pick her up but falls down too. They are helped up by the jester.

Jester E: Hahaha! Are you two after my job?

Herald: Please welcome, Prince Harry of the Daily Mail.

Bows and walks off

Herald: The Duke and Duchess Dotty.

Duke and Duchess act accordingly, silly walk

Herald: Lord Humphrey Humdinger

Lord Humphrey preens and does a low bow to the royalty then turns to the audience.

Lord H: Am I Smexy or what?

Jester M: What does Smexy mean?

Lord H: Oh get with it you silly little man, it means smart and sexy combined.

Jester E: Well you're not, is he?

Lord H: Oh yes I am.

led by Jester

Audience: oh no you're not etc

Herald: Pray silence and welcome the good fairies - Fairy Blossom, Fairy Willow

and Fairy Luna,.

All curtsy and wave their wands in the direction of the king and queen.

King F: Fairy Blossom, how good to see you. Do have a look at our dear little

Princess Kathryn.

Fairy Blossom: *looking into the cradle*

Oh my goodness such a cutie, I give her the gift of beauty

Hair like gold and eyes that sparkle

Looks to rival Meghan Markle

Queen P: How lovely and what gift do you bring Fairy willow?

Fairy Willow: Kindness is her gift from me.

Full of love she shall be,

Caring hands and a ready smile, Helpfulness will be her style.

Sudden crash of thunder and loud cackling is heard - enter The bad fairy - Arachne

Arachne: Haha, what a gathering, Royalty, gentry and nobility and of course

(indicating the audience) The Riff Raff of society.

Audience Boo led by the Jester. All the fairies quiver with fear and the King and Queen look terrified.

Arachne: Pleased to see me then, are you? ... As if I care. I am surprised though that

you'd invite these three pathetic fairies but that you didn't ask me... After

all I am the most powerful of all fairies - Arachne!

Queen: Oh Arachne, we are so sorry, it must have been an oversight. Of course

you are welcome to the christening.

Arachne: Like I said, I don't care and I don't take offense. I will now bestow my

gift on Princess Kathryn... (crash of thunder and stage darkens with a red light) Your daughter will indeed grow up to be beautiful and kind but I'm afraid that she will prick her finger on a spindle before her 18th birthday

and then she will ...DIE!!! Ahahahaha!

Another crash of thunder and Arachne leaves the stage All gasp. Queen scoops up the baby from the cradle and sobs. The whole court is silent apart from quiet crying.

Queen: Oh, our precious little baby. How could she be so mean?

King: Don't worry my dear, I will not allow this to happen. All spindles will be

banished from the kingdom and we will find a way to keep Kathryn safe

until she has turned 18.

Queen: But how?

King: As of today, this minute, I order the whole court to remove any spindles

in this court and kingdom! But with your gift... Can you undo the wicked

spell, Fairy Luna?

Fairy L: The wicked fairy's spell, is strong

And as we know, so very wrong, I cannot cancel out the spell

But I might be able to make it... well...

Better than it might have been

Arachne is so very mean!

Waving her wand at this point, as she makes the spell

Our princess beautiful and kind, With all good things we have in mind, Through my magic, will not Die The wicked spell I do defy.

Instead she will fall deep asleep,
For one hundred years, no less.
But so will everyone else as well
Even you lot I guess!(pointing at the audience)

A handsome prince will waken her With a passionate love's first kiss. So you had better stay awake' That's a part that you can't to miss.

The whole court cheers...

Queen P: But my dear, is that enough? What if the wicked fairy manages to magic another spinning wheel into the court before Kathryn reaches 18 years of age?

Fairy B: There's something else that we *can* do, But we will need consent from you.

Fairy W: In our cottage in a dell, We'll care for her and keep her well.

Fairy L: Arachne will not find her there, Your majesties, please don't despair.

Fairy B: When 18, she'll come back here, Not gone forever. Do not fear.

Nanny: This is just dreadful. I couldn't bear it if you took Princess Kathryn away. I've only just been made Nanny to her and I love her as if she's my own child.

Fairy W: We'll need some help, You know her well,

I think that you should come as well.

Queen P: But what about me? I'll be so sad to see my little princess go. I've waited so long for her. (crying quietly)

Fairy L: Arachne won't know Nanny exists, But she knows about the Queen. She'd hunt her down and she'd persist, You know she's horribly mean.

King: Yes My dear, Fairy Luna is right. If you left the court, Arachne would be sure to realise. Whereas Nanny here is nowhere near as famous and loved as you are.

Nanny N: Thanks a bunch!

But it's important to keep our little princess safe. May we visit from time to time?

Fairy W: I really don't think that is wise, Even if you're in disguise!

King, Queen and Nanny are crying now

Jester M: If only WhatsApp had been invented, we could keep in touch and the fairies could send pictures.

Queen P: But it hasn't! Any other bright ideas?

Jester E: Email?

Jester M: Don't be silly, that's not been invented yet either!

Audience: Oh yes it has! (led by prompt and Jester Nuff)

King F: (shouting)Stop all this noise. We must get serious! Everyone must away

to make the necessary arrangements.

Find all the spinning wheels in the court and burn them! Fairies go and prepare the cottage for our beautiful daughter.

Nanny, you must also prepare and pack everything that the princess wil

need.

Black out and curtains (if any) are drawn while everyone exits apart from Nanny and the two Jesters who walk front, centre stage and in front of tabs.

Scene 2

Jester M: Well, this is a right mess.

Nanny is crying

Jester E: Crying won't help!

Jester M: Well cheer her up then, tell her that little poem what you writ.

Nanny N: Writ? What happened to your grammar?

Jester M: She's at home with my grandpa.

Jester E: Would you like to hear my poem, Nanny?

Nanny N: Oh go on then...

Jester E: Right...

I've got a little bunny, Whose nose is always runny, But please don't think it's funny,

Jester M: 'Cos it's snot! Hahaha ...get it children? Snot, it's snot. Oh yes it is!

Jester E: (encouraging the children to join in) .Oh no it's snot! Etc.

Nanny N: Well really Jester Minute and Jester Nuff. I think that's enough of

encouraging children to use unpleasant words like snot.

Jester M: Oh no it's snot!

Audience participation

Jester E: Don't mind Jester Minute, he's new around here.

Nanny N: He looks second hand to me!

Jester M: That's because I got run over.

Jester E: Who by?

Jester M: By myself.

Nanny N: Don't be barmy, How can you run over yourself?

Jester M: Well, I asked Jester Nuff here to run across the road and get me some

sweets and he refused. So I ran over myself!

All laugh...

Nanny N: Oh I should have guessed it was a joke. After all you are the court

Jesters.

Jester E: How old are you, Nanny Nora?

Nanny N: Not that old!

Jester M: Really? You *look* very old.

Nanny N: How dare you! ... I must admit that I was born at a very young age and

do you know... my father died during childbirth?

Jester E: Your father?!

Nanny N: Yes, he was run over by the ambulance driving mummy to the hospital.

Jester M: When exactly was your birthday?

Nanny N: 9th December.

Jester E: Yes, but what year?

Nanny N: Every year! Stupid!

Jester M: Have you ever considered having plastic surgery to make you look

younger and more beautiful?

Nanny N: I've had a little.

Jester M: I don't know much about plastic surgery, but a good rule of thumb, is to

stop when you look permanently startled.

Jester E: You might have wanted to make a note of that.

Jester M: Have you never been married?

Nanny N: Oh yes, I'll have you know, that I've been married 16 times.

Jester M: Really?! 16 times?

Nanny N: Yes, 4 richer, 4 poorer, 4 better, 4 worse. I've really missed the last

husband. He was very poorly before he died. He had a terrible cough you know. I think if it was in the future we'd have called it Covid.

Jester E: And that killed him?

Nanny N: Not immediately, I covered him in Vick's vapour rub.

Jester M: Didn't that help?

Nanny N: No, it was very greasy and he went down-hill very fast. I'd already been

to the chemist twice. I asked what to do for a really bad cough and the lady said, "I don't know... ammonia cleaner." Well I thought, that's a

bit harsh. Ammonia would kill him, wouldn't it!

Jester E: No she meant... Oh never mind... How come you had that many

husbands?

Nanny N: Well, men just seem to find me irresistible. I mean, look at my dress

sense. I wear such beautiful frocks. Do you like this one? it's vintage.

Jester M: Did you make it yourself?

Jester E: And what about all the other husbands? Where have they all gone.

Nanny N: Oh you know - natural wastage. One fell in a vat of coffee . At least his

death was instant. Then I married a clumsy cleaner... He swept me off my feet. Then there was husband 5 who died of drink...He was run over by a Guinness delivery lorry... I loved husband number 7; he was a little strange though. He used to love being covered in cheese. He was a real cracker! Hahaha. Oh and I was very happy with husband number 10 until he bought us a waterbed, but then I'm afraid that we drifted apart.

So much more I could tell you... Anyway, Now I've decided to stay single and do a proper job, looking after Princess Kathryn. I know, I'm beautiful and many men still desire me but I've decided... So stop

looking at me like that young man (points to a man in the audience) I'm

no longer available.

Jester M: Hadn't you better go and pack?

Nanny N: Good Lord, what time is it?

Jester E: Hair past freckle. (Looks at where his watch should be)

Nanny: What's that supposed to mean?

Jester E: It means that I don't own a watch.

Nanny: I've got to get ready quickly or the fairies will go without me and I

don't know the way.

Jester M: Well off you go then and take great care of Princess Kathryn.

Nanny N: Of course I will, and thank for cheering me up.

Jester E: It's our pleasure ...it's always good to look on the bright side of life.

Song for the Jesters. Always look on the Bright Side of Life - Monty Python

Some things in life are bad
They can really make you mad
Other things just make you swear and curse
When you're chewing on life's gristle
Don't grumble, give a whistle
And this'll help things turn out for the best

And

Always look on the bright side of life Always look on the light side of life

If life seems jolly rotten
There's something you've forgotten
And that's to laugh and smile and dance and sing
When you're feeling in the dumps
Don't be silly chumps
Just purse your lips and whistle, that's the thing

And

Music fades as do lights as they go off singing. Lights down

Scene 3 - In the woods, on the way to the Fairies' cottage

Fairies flit across the stage from right to left and don't come back. All through the scene the animals are seen popping their heads around the trees/set

Fairy Willow: Come on Nanny, we must make haste and get to the cottage before anyone sees us.

Nanny N: (Calling from off stage) I'm doing my best, And I'm hurrying as much as I can but I have two left feet. So progress is harder for me than most.

Nanny enters carrying Princess Kathryn in her arms.

Nanny N: (Addresses the audience)... Yes it's true, I do have two left feet. I can't buy Flip flops. I have to buy Flop Flops.

Oh dear little Kathryn...I think I'm going to call you Kate. How precious you are and *very* heavy! (*Addresse: the audience*) You know, My mum used to say, "When they're little they make your arms ache and when they're older they make your heart ache." She was right!

Sound of footsteps and rustling is heard

Ooh, did you hear that noise? No? Well, I heard something. It's really rather scary in these woods when you're alone.

Eerie music and noise gets louder and enter the two Jesters...Nanny is trembling with fear...

Nanny N: Oh dear Lord, it's you two! I nearly had a heart attack!

Jester M: Good job you didn't, who would look after Kathryn then?

Jester E: We brought your bag; you forgot to take it with you.

Nanny N: Oh dear, yes I did, but I can't carry that and the baby, anyway, and the

fairies have gone on ahead.

Jester M: Don't worry we'll come with you and go back to the palace once you're

safely at the Cottage.

Jester E: Will we? But it is a rather scary place. I don't like the look of it.

Nanny N: Nor do I!

Jester M: It feels creepy.

Nanny N: Do you think it's haunted?

Jester E: I want to go.

Nanny N: You should have gone before you came out.

Jester E: No, I mean I want to go home.

Jester M: I hope we don't see a ghost.

Nanny N: Well, perhaps the boys and girls can shout out and warn us if they see a

ghost .

Jester M: Will you do that boys and girls?

Nanny: What should they shout out?

Jester E: How about ZIM?

Nanny N: Why ZIM?

Jester E: Because we'll know it's 'im!

Jester M: Well we'd better have a practise...

Jester E: No, don't be daft. I've heard that if we sing, that will keep ghosts

away.

Jester M: If *you* sing, that would keep *anything* away!

Nanny N: What should we sing?

Jester M: How about Ten Green Bottles?

Jester E: Good idea.

Nanny: Don't forget to warn us if you see a ghost!

They start to sing and the usual routine of 'it's behind you' interrupting the song several times ...'where? I can't see anything' etc. Repeat several times during the song.

Ten green bottles hanging on the wall

TEN green bottles hanging on the wall, TEN green bottles hanging on the wall,

And if one green bottle should accidentally fall, There'll be...

NINE green bottles hanging on the wall...

EIGHT green bottles hanging on the wall...

SEVEN green bottles hanging on the wall...

SIX green bottles hanging on the wall...

FIVE green bottles hanging on the wall...

FOUR green bottles hanging on the wall...

THREE green bottles hanging on the wall...

TWO green bottles hanging on the wall...

ONE green bottle hanging on the wall...

NO green bottles hanging on the wall!

Eventually Nanny gets tapped on the shoulder by the ghost...

Nanny: Stop tapping me on the shoulder, I'm trying to sing.

The two Jesters are either side of her

Jester M: It wasn't me (looks at Jester E)

Jester E: Wasn't me either! (looks at Jester M)

They look at each other and slowly turn their heads to look behind Nanny and see the ghost... Both scream and run off, exiting one each side of the stage.

Nanny does a turn and still can't see the ghost who leaves the stage for good, while she's facing the front.

Nanny:

Well, a fat lot of good they were. There's no ghost and yet they've run away leaving me on my own with the baby. Men always leave women holding the baby don't they ladies?

I have to find my way to this cottage, and soon, before baby Kate gets fractious and needs a feed. I'm beginning to wonder if I've done the right thing bringing her here to live in the woods with just 3 fairies and me. (gets out her hanky and begins to sob)

Enter the animals (children) who've been bobbing heads around the set throughout-

Animal 1: Hello, can we help you?

Nanny N: Not unless you can feed a baby!

Animal 2: We can try.

Nanny N: No, don't worry it would be hard for you to hold a baby without hands.

Animal 3: Hasn't the baby got any hands?

Nanny N: No, silly, of course she has hands. I mean you! You have paws and that

would make it difficult to hold a bottle and a baby.

Animal 1: Oh, I see, but there must be something we can do to help you.

Animal 2: Are you lost?

Nanny N: Well, I am a bit, I'm afraid.

Animal 3: Where are you trying to get to?

Nanny N: I'm trying to find the three fairies that live in these woods.

Animal 1: Do you mean Willow, Blossom and Luna? They live very close to here.

Nanny N: Yes, they're the ones. Do you know them then?

Animal 2: Do we know them? (laughs)

Animal 3: We know them very well actually. You see they're our fairy

Godmothers.

Animal 1: They always look out for us and keep us safe.

Animal 2: They've taught us to always try to be kind.

Animal 3: And helpful.

Nanny N: That's so good to hear.

Animal 1: They taught us a song to help us remember to be kind.

Animal 2: Would you like to hear it?

Nanny N: I really would like to hear it.

Song - For the animals and Nanny Try a little kindness-Glenn Campbell

Then I'll put a spell on the princess that will make her go into the attic the day before her 18th birthday. Ahahahaha! I love being wicked and I do it so well. It's all

Audience - Oh no it isn't etc

Arachne: Oh what do you all know?! You're just a gormless rabble wasting your

time watching pantomimes. You'd think you'd have something better to

do!

Exit left

Scene 4 - In the fairies cottage... fairies addressing the audience at first

Fairy W: Well who would have believed it...nearly 18 years we've been looking

after Princess Kathryn, Kate, she likes to be called.

Fairy B: Yes, the time has flown and she has no idea that she's a princess.

Fairy L: We're not going to tell her until her 18th birthday in case she wants to

go home to the palace.

going my way, isn't it?

Fairy W: We've had to pretend to her that we found her in the woods when she

was a baby and have looked after her ever since.

Fairy B: I can't wait to get my wings back and be able to tell her that we are

really fairies and that she is a princess.

Fairy L: Yes, I hope she won't be too cross with us for keeping the secret for so

long.

We hear footsteps, enter Princess K.

Fairy W: Oh, here she is now.

Fairy B: Hello my dear, have you had a nice walk?

Princess K: Yes, thank you. I met with all the lovely animals and picked these

flowers for you all.

Fairy L: Thank you, these are lovely and it's so kind of you, you didn't need to

do that!

Princess K: But I wanted to do it. You are all so kind to me. How do I deserve such

a loving family?

Fairy W: We love you Kate, and have so enjoyed watching you grow up into a

beautiful young woman.

Princess K: Where's Nanny Nora?

Fairy B: She went out for a run, just a few minutes ago. I'm surprised you

didn't see her.

Enter Nanny N huffing and puffing

Princess K: Hello Nanny, I hear that you've only just gone out for a run.

Nanny N: Well, I'm trying to keep fit but I had to come back as I'd forgotten

something.

Princess K: Oh... What had you forgotten?

Nanny N: I forgot that I'm out of shape and couldn't run for more than one

minute!

Princess K: Well at least you tried. The spirit was willing.

Nanny N: But the flesh was weak.

They all laugh and Princess K hugs Nanny...

Princess K: I do love you all so much. I wish you'd tell me how you became my

family?

Fairy W: It's a little complicated to be honest.

Fairy B: All you need to know is that you were in danger and we decided to

bring you to our cottage to keep you safe.

Princess K: That's rather strange but it's still good to be here. I couldn't ask for a

more loving family.

They try to change the subject

Fairy L: Do you realise that it's your birthday soon!

Princess K: I know, so exciting!

Fairy W: You will be 18 in just 2 days' time.

Nanny N: We intend to have a little party for you. Would you like me to make a

special cake?

Fairy B: I don't think so Nanny. We love you dearly, but you are no cook.

Nanny N: How rude!

Fairy L: But you do use the smoke alarm as a timer, Nanny, and you make up the

recipe as you go along.

Nanny N: That's because it's no good following recipes, is it? Once a recipe told

me to set the oven to 180 degrees, so I did. But then I couldn't open the

door because the cooker was facing the wall.

All laugh...

Nanny N At least I can make you laugh. Here, listen to this... What scary cake

keeps coming back.

Princess K: I don't know. What scary cake keeps coming back?

Nanny N: A Boo - meringue! get it?

All laugh

Princess K: Oh you are funny Nanny.

Fairy W: Shall we make Coq au Vin for your birthday supper?

Nanny N: Coq au Vin? I thought that was love in a lorry!

Fairy B: Besides, I prefer to eat vegan food.

Fairy L: Me too. People who sell meat are gross!

Nanny N: People who sell fruit and vegetables are grocer! - (Laughs at her own

joke) I do make myself laugh!

Now what *shall* we do for your birthday?

Princess K: I really don't mind as long as we're all together.

Song: We Are family - Sister Sledge - for all on stage

One verse and 2 choruses

We are family
I got all my sisters with me

Get up, everybody, and sing

Scene 5 - back at the palace - King and Queen, King Collecters on stage and courtiers cleaning the place up ready for Princes Kate's return after her 16th birthday

King F: Just a few days to go now my dear before our darling girl returns to us.

Queen P: I'm so excited, but anxious as well. What if she's cross that we have kept the information from her for all these years. She thinks that the fairies and Nanny N found her in the forest. I do hope we've not made a mistake.

Jester M: Don't worry if you have, To err is human.

Jester E: But to arrr is pirate.

They both laugh

King: C: Hahaha, very good, but not to worry. When she meets my son William, she'll be over the moon.

Jester M: That's no good, we need her here!

Queen P: Where is William by the way? I thought he was arriving with you in time for the celebration.

King C: Oh, he'll be here in time. He decided to go by horse through the forest rather than come in the carriage with me. You know how independent these young people like to be.

King F: Well, I'm feeling very anxious. What can we do to make the time pass quickly?

Queen P: Could the Jester's entertain us?

King F: Good idea, my dear.

Jester E: Who's idea, yours or hers?

King F: Hers of course.

Jester M: But you said My idea.

King F: Oh no I didn't, did I everyone?

Jesters: Oh yes he did (encouraging audience to agree with them)

King F: Oh no I didn't!

Audience participation until King shouts

King F: That's enough of this nonsense.

Jester E: But you wanted something to pass the time.

King F: Something interesting and sensible, not silliness.

Jester M: I know, get me a clock.

Jester E runs to side stage and brings a clock large enough for audience to see what it is.

Jester E: Here you go, a clock

Jester M: Right give it to me.

Jester M passes the clock to someone else on stage and they pass it to someone else until it gets to the king.

King F: What on earth are you doing, you fools?

Jester M: We're passing the time.

Jester E: That's what you wanted isn't it?

King F: Yes but not literally!

Jester M: So do you want us to pass the time or not?

King F: Of course, but not like that!

Jester E: Has anyone in the audience got a *watch* we can borrow then , to pass

the time?
